The report focuses on the key indicators related to:

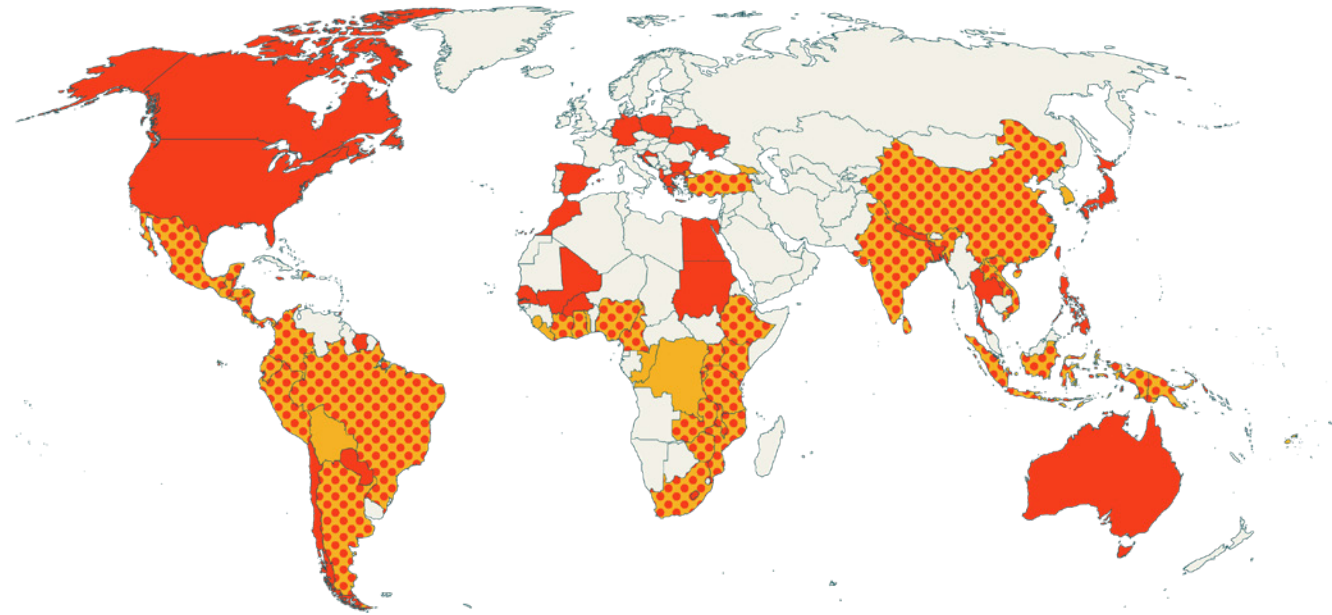
- **Market uptake:** sales of Rainforest Alliance Certified™ and UTZ certified crops;

<b>WORKERS ON RAINFOREST ALLIANCE CERTIFIED™ FARMS:</b>	Any person who works on a farm or for a group administrator and is paid for his or her work. Encompasses all types of workers, including permanent, temporary, documented, undocumented, migrant, and transitory, and also persons temporarily absent from a job or enterprise at which they recently worked for illness, parental leave, holiday, training, or industrial dispute. Includes the workers hired by individual smallholders.
<b>WORKERS ON UTZ CERTIFIED FARMS:</b>	Total number of permanent and seasonal workers for Certificate Holders (workers on estates and group staff at IMS level). Does not include workers hired by smallholders/group members.
